

We are excited to tell you about an ongoing recycling effort that will benefit CURE Childhood Cancer (www.curechildhoodcancer.org) and the environment.

Through CURE Recycling, (www.curerecycling.com) we will be collecting empty inkjets, toner cartridges, and used cell phones to be donated and recycled.

CURE Childhood Cancer was founded in 1975, when barely three out of ten children with cancer survived. Today, thanks to clinical and laboratory research, an average of seven out of ten children with cancer survive. But cancer still kills more children than any other disease. With new diagnoses of childhood cancer reaching epidemic numbers, funding this critical research is now more important than ever.

Environmentally, this year over 400 million printer cartridges and 130 million cell phones will be thrown in the trash. They contain arsenic, antimony, beryllium, cadmium, copper, lead, nickel, and zinc. When dumped into landfills, these toxins work their way into the groundwater. When incinerated, they form highly toxic dioxins & furans. These toxins have been associated with cancer, and a range of reproductive, neurological and developmental disorders. Recycling them really makes sense.

Your participation can help make a difference! We also encourage you to collect them from friends and neighbors. With your involvement, this recycling effort will be an extremely rewarding experience, and support a very worthy cause.
